



This seal for York city was designed by J. Horace Rudy, Reinhardt Dempwolf, and James Glessner. The rope and corn on the outside of the seal represent York's industrial and farming history. A red rose surrounds the white rose, showing York County growing out of Lancaster County. The dark blue shield - honoring German settlers - and two crossed, golden streets - representing Market and George Streets - form a square. The original court house, meeting place of the Second Continental Congress, once stood in this square. The American eagle, the three cannonballs of William Penn, and the court house represent national, state, and local governments.
